### We Encourage Global Worming

You may or may not have heard about our Worm compost project that we have had going on in our school this year. It contains Red Wiggler worms (*Eisenia Fetida*). It takes up very little space and does not smell bad. Everyone in the school works together to reduce the amount of garbage we produce. Our worm compost is one way we reduce garbage in the classrooms, in the staff room and in the office. We feed our Red Wigglers vegetables, fruits, coffee grounds, tea bags, wood chips and shredded paper from the office. We sometimes feed them citrus scraps (oranges, lemons, limes, grapefruit, and tangerines). These foods are not the best foods for our worms, so we do not give them very much. We can feed them starches (potatoes, rice, noodles), but usually do not because these

foods can smell when they decompose. We never feed them spicy foods like onions and hot peppers or oily foods like dairy products or meat because our worms do not really like these foods and they start to rot in the bin. For more information, keep an eye on our website . . .
